Student Business Services is your Florida Prepaid contact at Florida State University. We identify students with Florida Prepaid College Plans and bill your plan automatically. Your billing will post to your **my.fsu.edu** account statement by the end of the first week of classes.

No paperwork required! Save time and keep your Florida Prepaid card at home.

- •There is no need to notify us that you have Prepaid. Our billing system links to Florida Prepaid through your social security number.
- •If you keep your Florida Prepaid Account current, we bill it automatically.
- •We bill Prepaid for the number of credit hours you take each term. We can never bill for more hours than you are taking, but we can bill for fewer at your request. Complete the FLPP Billing Change form to cancel or lessen your billing for a specific term.

Florida Prepaid: All About Florida College and State University Fees

Whether you already have a Prepaid Plan or are looking to purchase one, you may be wondering what fees are charged by Florida schools and what exactly is covered by us. While tuition covers the basic costs of instruction, the other fees exist to help cover the other costs of operating a school. Below you'll find a glossary of the fees charged by Florida Colleges and State Universities and, more importantly, how they work with your Prepaid Plan. This should not be considered a comprehensive list and you should contact the school you plan to attend for more specific information.

Fees and what they mean:

Tuition

These are part of the mandatory fees charged by schools and Local Fees covered under Prepaid Plans as Tuition. No matter what, your Specific fees charged by both Florida Colleges and State Prepaid Plan guarantees the cost of Tuition at a Florida College or State University (whichever your plan was designed aren't used by the student. for).

Fees covered under Tuition in a State University Plan:

Matriculation Fee – This fee is what many people know plainly as tuition, the basic fee charged for instruction at a school. Student Financial Aid Fee - This fee is charged for Financial Aid purposes. It does not exceed five percent of tuition. Capital Improvement Fee – This fee helps maximize the use of existing facilities and promotes campus development.

Fees covered under Tuition in a Florida College Plan:

Tuition Fee – This fee is what many people know as tuition, the basic fee charged for instruction at a school.

Student Financial Aid Fee – This fee is charged for Financial Aid purposes. It does not exceed five percent of tuition.

Capital Improvement Fee – This fee helps maximize the use of existing facilities and promotes campus development.

Tuition Differential Fee

Charged just by State Universities, this fee was approved by the 2007 Florida Legislature to support undergraduate programs and services.

Universities. These fees are mandatory even if the services

Athletics Fee – Supports a school's athletic programs. Activities and Services Fee – Supports student boards and organizations to improve services related to student activities.

Health Fee – Provides students with access to campus-based health services.

Technology Fee* – In this context, Technology Fee refers only to the Technology Fee charged by Florida Colleges to support technology access.

Campus Fees

These are any and all other fees charged by a specific school to cover any campus costs. These could include: Transportation Fees, Student Facilities Fees, Lab Fees or Green Fees.

Want to know which fees are charged by a specific school and how much they may be? No problem! Each school lists a cost breakdown on their website. Though each one is organized a little different, they all have certain costs and fees in common. Check out Florida State University, University of Central Florida or University North Florida for a few examples.

What fees does a Prepaid Plan cover?

Contract Year 2007 and Earlier:

Your plan includes:

Tuition Differential Fee (TDF) – however, all 4-Year University and 2+2 Prepaid Plans purchased

before 2007 are exempt from paying the TDF. So, while it's not covered in your plan, you won't have to worry about paying it.

Local Fees – your plan does not cover Local Fees. However, should you want to cover those costs, you can purchase the Local Fee Plan.

This supplement plan will guarantee the costs of these Local Fees.*

Campus Fees – your plan does not cover Campus Fees.

Contract Year 2008 to 2010:
